- Assist in the evaluation and selection of digital products and tools, including analysis and estimates of feasibility and costs, to ensure compatibility and inter-operability with Ministry and sector applications and systems, and focus on continuous improvement
- Instigate periodic reviews and updates to the Enterprise Architecture, maintaining current best practice and seeking ways to continuously improve, in adherence with the Ministry's digital, information and business strategies
- Provide leadership, mentoring and guidance to project teams and stakeholders to both champion and further understanding of the role of Enterprise Architecture within the Ministry.
