Tēnei Tūranga | About the role

The Senior Database Administrator is a senior specialist role providing technical leadership and deep expertise in the design, operation, optimisation, and security of enterprise database platforms across on-premises and cloud environments.

The role ensures high availability, performance, resilience, and data protection for mission-critical systems operating in hybrid and multi-cloud environments, including Microsoft Azure and Amazon Web Services (AWS). It supports the Ministry's data and cloud modernisation strategy by applying automation, DevOps practices, and modern engineering approaches to deliver reliable, scalable, and secure database services.

This role balances traditional database administration responsibilities with modern cloud and platform engineering practices and acts as a senior technical authority and escalation point within the database and cloud services domain.

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Ngā Haepapa | Accountabilities

As a Senior Database Administrator Te Tāhuhu o te Mātauranga | the Ministry of Education you will:

- Share specialist database and cloud knowledge across the organisation to support informed operational and strategic decision-making.
- Contribute to a high-performing, collaborative, and inclusive team culture.
- Lead the resolution of complex technical issues and manage associated risks.
- Design and implement fit-for-purpose, future-focused database solutions aligned with organisational strategy.
- Use data and insights to provide evidence-based recommendations.
- Build capability in others through mentoring, coaching, and knowledge sharing.

As the Senior Database Administrator, you will:

- Provide senior technical ownership and stewardship of enterprise database platforms across on-premises, Microsoft Azure, and AWS environments.
- Design, implement, and operate high-availability, backup, recovery, and disaster recovery solutions appropriate to each hosting model.
- Lead database performance tuning, capacity planning, and optimisation across physical, virtual, and cloud-hosted platforms.
- Ensure database security, access controls, encryption, and compliance with organisational policies and standards.
- Plan and deliver database migrations and modernisation initiatives between on-premises and cloud platforms.
- Act as a senior escalation point for complex incidents affecting hybrid database services.
- Apply automation, scripting, and Infrastructure as Code to improve reliability, consistency, and operational efficiency.
- Work closely with cloud, infrastructure, application, and security teams to deliver integrated hybrid solutions.
- Mentor and support other technical staff, sharing specialist knowledge and best practice.

You will make decisions in accordance with the Ministry's policies and delegations framework.

- Relevant tertiary qualification in Information Technology or equivalent practical experience.

- Amazon Web Services (AWS) certification relevant to infrastructure or database platforms (e.g. AWS Certified Solutions Architect – Associate, AWS Certified SysOps Administrator, or equivalent)
