The role will:

- work across Te Pou Tuarongo to integrate insights that support the delivery of high-quality work within Te Pou Tuarongo and more widely
- provide expert advice and guidance on strategic and practical implementation of Ka Hikitia and Tau Mai
 Te Reo strategies to support an integrated delivery approach and excellent and equitable outcomes for
 Māori learners and all learners of te reo Māori.



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The Senior Advisor – Integrated Insights will also build and maintain relationships across Te Tāhuhu o Te Mātauranga and other education agencies to collect, capture and integrate insights.

Ngā Haepapa | Accountabilities

As a Specialist within Te Tāhuhu o te Mātauranga | the Ministry of Education you will:

- Share specialist knowledge across the organisation and with stakeholders, working with others to inform operational level decision making.
- Contribute to an effective team with a positive approach to the work environment that encourages and supports high performance, collaboration and problem solving.
- Lead the resolution of issues, identifying risks and solutions to protect and enhance the integrity and reputation of the Ministry.
- Lead or contribute to the development and implementation of innovative and fit-for purpose solutions and frameworks for current and future challenges.

As the Senior Advisor, Integrated Insights you will deliver the following:

Te Tiriti o Waitangi Partnership

- Work through formal and informal networks across Te Tāhuhu to promote understanding and respect for Te Tiriti |Treaty and tangata whenuatanga.
- Lead efforts to ensure the Tiriti |Treaty is considered as part of significant new policy developments or initiatives and provide expert advice and leadership in Te Tiriti | Treaty policy, strategy and work programme implementation.
- Contribute to the implementation practices in Te Tāhuhu that give life to a Te Tiriti o Waitangi
 partnership, through a focus on enabling Tino Rangatiratanga. And, applying te reo Māori, tikanga Māori,
 mātauranga Māori appropriately.
- Provide advice on policies and opportunities which foster improved understanding of Te Tiriti partnership responsibilities and make recommendations based on data and evidence.

Strategy

- Engage with strategic and business partners with a focus on Ka Hikitia and Tau Mai te Reo including internal hoamahi (colleagues), education sector partners and whānau.
- Provide advice to build coordinated leadership and action for the implementation of Ka Hikitia and Tau
 Mai Te Reo across the Ministry and to support sector-wide implementation.
- Make recommendations based on analysis and evidence to support the implementation of policy and strategy that drives the outcomes of Ka Hikitia and Tau Mai te Reo.
- Champion Te Tāhuhu efforts to shape practices that deliver on Ka Hikitia and Tau Mai te Reo.

• Provide leadership within the team and Te Pou Tuarongo to support high quality service and advice that delivers on Ka Hikitia and Tau Mai Te Reo.



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Relationships

- Champion effective relationships practice within Te Tāhuhu and externally.

- Actively contribute to the quality control of team advice and other work through regular participation in peer review, policy appraisal and discussion of issues.

- Analytical thinking synthesises complex data and policy to generate actionable insights.
- Communication articulates ideas clearly and simply. Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Collaboration works effectively across teams to give effect to and achieve strategic priorities.

- Experience working in partnership with Māori, including iwi, hapū, and Māori organisations, to support improved outcomes is desired.
- Experience of working in Māori education to support excellent and equitable education outcomes for Māori learners and/or all learners of te reo Māori is desired.
- Experience of developing and implementing strategies designed to achieve equitable outcomes is desired.
- Experience in translating national strategies into actionable insights and implementation plans including measuring for impact.
- Experience in integrating insights from diverse sources to inform strategic decision-making and improve service delivery is desired.
- Experience in building and maintaining relationships across teams, business groups, agencies, including influencing senior leaders and stakeholders.
- Proven ability to communicate complex ideas clearly, both in writing and verbally, to a range of audiences.
